A nine-member NBA expercommittee visited our institute from 19 April 2024 to 21 April 2024 under the chairmanship of Dr N V Ramana Rao, Director of NIT Raipur. Based on this committee's recommendations, the NBA granted the accreditation for four UC programs on 30.06.2027. a) Mechanical Engineering b) Computer Science and Engineering c) Civil Engineering d) Electrical Engineering Chairman Dr Vikram S Patil, Director, ADCET, congratulates all stakeholders for this remarkable achievement. Dr S. S. Sayyad, Dr S. S. Mohite, Dr Balkrishnan P, and Dr M M Jadhav shared the experiences, suggestions, and comments from this visit with all other members. As a detailed report is still awaiting from the NBA, it has been decided to discuss it briefly in the next meeting. 
